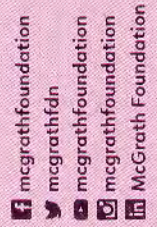

A helping hand

McGrath Breast Health Nurses are registered nurses with specialist training in breast cancer care. Providing support, information and care from the time of diagnosis, a McGrath Breast Care Nurse can be with you throughout your experience with breast cancer – through any treatments you might need, including chemotherapy, radiation therapy and surgery; rehabilitation, counselling, and follow-up services.

Your McGrath Breast Care Nurse is likely to:

- Answer any questions you or your family might have
- Provide information about treatment options, and how these might affect you
- Contact and support you during hospital stays
- Give you information about breast prosthesis and reconstruction
- Organise support for when you leave hospital and return home
- Refer you to other services when you need them
- Coordinate care from diagnosis through treatment and follow-up
- Act as the common link between all the healthcare professionals you'll see, including your GP, surgeon, oncologist and other people
- Put you in touch with support groups, wig libraries and other useful resources
- Offer emotional support throughout your breast cancer experience
- Be available to answer any questions or offer support or guidance, whether you're in the middle of treatment or your treatment is complete.
